WHO WE ARE

The YWCA is the oldest and largest multicultural women's organization in the world.

YWCA of Central Virginia was founded in 1912 by an amazing group of women. These same women went on to raise the funds to erect a building that would provide safe and affordable housing for women and would support the mission of the YW throughout the community. In 1918, our Town Center building in the City of Lynchburg opened its doors and we have been opening doors for the women, children, and families of Central Virginia ever since. In fact, the YWCA has never closed; not one day in over 105 years!

Since 1912 the YWCA has grown and adapted to meet the needs of our community. Today we serve thousands of women, girls, men, boys, and families each year through our programs, opening doors every day. Our service area encompasses seven counties and two cities; an area of 4,440 square miles with a population of over 410,000 community members.




